It gives me great pleasure to write in praise and support of two extraordinary teachers and a visionary local history project that they have created in the Catherine Street/Chinatown neighborhood. At P.S. 126/MAT on Catherine Street, Alfonso Guerriero, Jr. (Social Studies) and Christopher Piccigallo (Special Education) have created the Lower East Side Young Historians project. Working with junior high school students from diverse backgrounds, they have engaged students in historical research, image collection and graphic design work, all of which have come together to create multiple historic signage placards that tell the unique story of the community that their homes and school are located in.

In order to save the project time, Christopher and Alfonso have very shrewdly involved the NYC Parks Commission, which has helped secure the signage permits.
